Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Consultation on Building Communities of Specialist Provision for Children and Young People with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities in Lincolnshire

You will already have received a joint letter from the school and Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) informing you of the start of the consultation period about possible changes to enhance the provision for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) in Lincolnshire. You may also have seen or heard news items on Look North and BBC Radio Lincolnshire regarding this too.

The proposed plans for special schools and SEND provision are both ambitious and exciting. Both I, and the other Head Teachers of Lincolnshire's special schools, have been discussing and influencing the development of the strategy for the last 18 months. We are confident that the plans for the future will bring about real and lasting improvements for pupils across Lincolnshire.

It is important that you are aware of what Lincolnshire County Council and special school providers are suggesting in their strategy. You can find out more details by going to www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/SENDcommunities. Please make any comments and suggestions you feel should be considered before any final decisions are made. The closing date for consultation is Wednesday 14th March 2018.

To further inform you of what is planned and how this may affect The Priory and Garth Schools, we will be hosting two consultation events. The first of these will be at The Priory School on Tuesday 6th February, starting at 5 p.m. in the school hall. The other will be at the Parent/Carer Coffee morning on Friday 2nd February at 10 a.m. also at the school. These sessions will cover the reasons for change, the proposals and a capture of your views.
